Sickle cell disease is the most common inherited blood disorder in the United States, affecting an estimated 90,000 to 100,000 Americans. Sickle cell disease can also be extremely painful and is associated with a number of severe health complications. The Memphis area has the second highest population of adult sickle cell patients in the nation, with over 1,700 adult sickle cell patients.

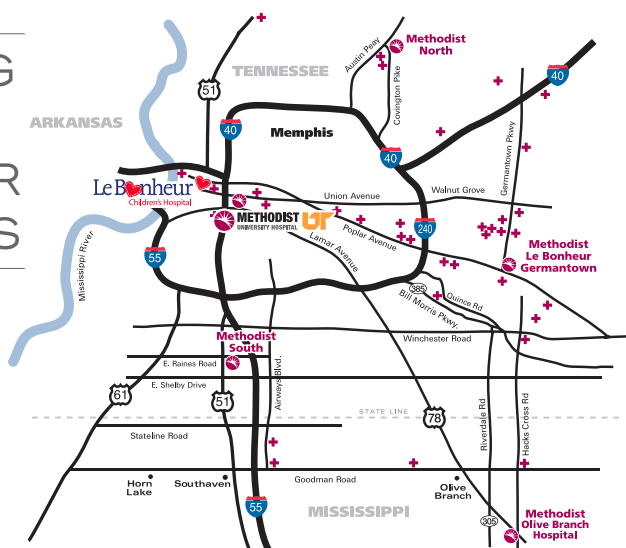
