



A LEGACY OF GENEROSITY

Family Honors the Memory of Beloved Anesthesiologist, Dr. Dinesh Chauhan, with Gift to The Pavilion at Methodist Le Bonheur Germantown Hospital

When the late Dinesh Chauhan, MD moved to Memphis in 1977, he began what would be a lifetime commitment and enduring legacy of giving back to the community. A respected anesthesiologist, he was also a beloved teacher, philanthropist and volunteer.

Dr. Chauhan's anesthesiology practice was closely connected to obstetrics, including a long-time affiliation with Methodist Le Bonheur Germantown Hospital. His legacy includes a vast network of grateful patients who received excellent care, as well as students with whom he forged enduring relationships.

Wishing to honor Dr. Chauhan after his passing, his family—including sons, Chirag, a financial advisor and managing partner at Bluff City Advisory Group, and Ravi, a urologist with The Conrad Pearson Clinic, along with their respective wives, Mandy and Heather, and children, Cole, Blake, Reid and Claire—strived to continue his philanthropic work. To honor Dr. Chauhan and his legacy of giving back to the community, his family presented the Methodist Healthcare Foundation with a generous gift to support the renovation of the Expectant Parent Waiting Room in The Pavilion at Methodist Le Bonheur Germantown.

"My dad's work was often behind the scenes, so we wanted to honor his life by creating a special space that would welcome people to the hospital where he spent the majority of his career," said Chirag. "We're grateful to be able to continue his legacy of giving. This room is a testament to his generous spirit and commitment to serving others."

The Expectant Parent Waiting Room is a wonderful addition to the top-level amenities of The Pavilion, providing a tranquil space for families to unwind during the exciting but often stressful wait when anticipating the arrival of a new baby. The Chauhan family gathered in January 2024 for a blessing of the new room.

STEADFAST PHILANTHROPY

New Sherard Society Honors Longtime Foundation Donors

The Sherard Society, one of four new giving societies launched by the Methodist Healthcare Foundation in 2022, recognizes the commitment of donors who have generously supported the Methodist Healthcare Foundation for 20 or more years.

The society is named after Methodist Le Bonheur Healthcare founder, John Sherard, who traveled to Memphis from Mississippi in 1899 to visit his pastor in the charity ward of a hospital in Memphis. Shocked by the conditions of available healthcare options and troubled that Memphis had no Methodist hospital, Sherard was determined to build one. His belief that people are obligated to care for each other inspired a campaign to create a hospital that would be "a powerful factor in reaching the hearts of the people and strengthening their faith."

Nearly 20 years later, in 1918, Sherard's efforts culminated in the establishment of the first standalone Methodist Hospital in the region. The Sherard Society's name reflects a rich history spanning more than a century and is befitting for the group of the Foundation's most dedicated donors. It is also meaningful that many Sherard Society members are former MLH Associates.

The inaugural Sherard Society event took place in September 2023 at the beautiful riverside home of Sally Aldrich, Foundation Board Vice Chair and Sherard Society member. Aldrich is the former Chief Nursing Officer of the MLH Affiliated Services Division, which oversees the Methodist Hospice Residence.

Reflecting on her experience with MLH, Aldrich said, "Hospice was something very tangible to me. Here's this structure that represents the best about Methodist: caring for people less fortunate, caring for people at the end of life. That's what I did, and that's what I cared about. Hospice gave me a vehicle to give to Methodist year after year."

Aldrich emphasized the importance of loyal giving, noting, "It's about creating something that lasts, something that will stand the test of time, through changes and challenges. The belief in our mission, our commitment to provide care and compassion to all—this defines the spirit of the Sherard Society. By supporting the work of the Foundation, we are continuing John Sherard's legacy, recognizing that each one of us has the ability to better our community and make a lasting difference in the lives of others. The name Sherard embodies steadfastness."

Methodist Initiative Supports Community in Becoming Healthier

In September 2023, Methodist Le Bonheur Healthcare launched Healthier 901, a bold new initiative that issues a challenge to the Mid-South: become a healthier community by losing a collective one million pounds over three years.

Our most recent Community Health Needs Assessment identified cardiovascular disease and cancer as the first and second leading causes of death in the Memphis area. Reflecting MLH's responsiveness to our community's health needs, Healthier 901 was created to reduce our risk for these conditions by tackling a prime risk factor for both: obesity. Memphis is one of the heaviest cities in the United States, with obesity affecting over one-third of our population. That means 1 in 3 Memphians face significantly higher risk factors for chronic and life-threatening conditions.

The movement officially kicked off with the Healthier 901 Fest at Shelby Farms Park. Thousands of attendees enjoyed an action-packed day led by co-emcees MLH President and CEO, Michael Ugwueke, DHA, FACHE, and Sherri Shepherd, actress and Emmy Award-winning talk show host. Participants enjoyed exercise sessions with the YMCA and certified personal

trainer, Ricky Dortch, healthy cooking demonstrations with Chefs Kelly English and Chris Beavers, family-friendly activities and more.

Individuals, churches, schools and businesses have stepped up to our challenge, making use of the Healthier 901 app, which offers a convenient way to record weight loss, track fitness activities, log meals, discover healthy tips and chat with community members.

Healthier 901 truly represents a community effort. As a powerful voice in community health, MLH took the lead, organizing a unified front of gyms and fitness centers, restaurants that offer healthier options, exercise advocates and local businesses to equip our community with the resources to lose weight and live healthier lives.
